

Greetings fellow young farmers! It seems that this winter season is flying by. This was an exciting year for SYA because this year Saskatoon was host to the Canadian Young Farmers Forum annual conference. As a first time attendee it was a bit overwhelming. Farmers wearing all kinds of

different hats descended on the Paris of the Prairies to meet and discuss all things Ag.

It would be difficult to give you a complete overview as there were dozens of presentations on every topic from "Agvocacy", to leadership, to finances, all the way to the wonders of maple syrup. Friday's conference opened with a great presentation from Dr. David Posen on the topic of stress and stress management.
